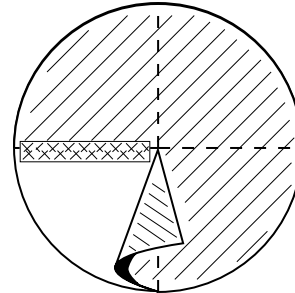
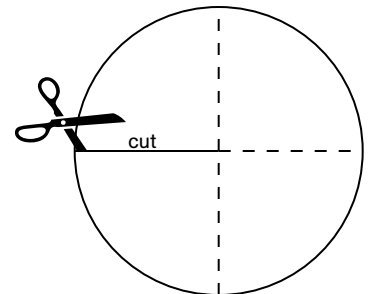
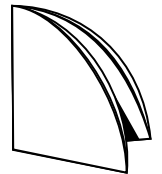


Materials

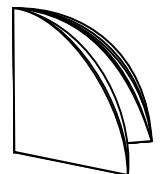
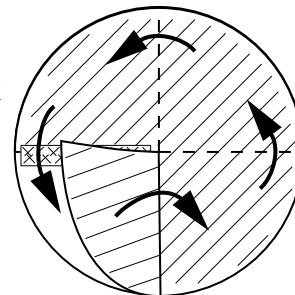
- 12" x 12" paper (2 sheets per book)
- scissors, tape, crayons

Directions

1. Draw a circle on the paper and cut it out. Use it as a template to make another circle. Cut out the second circle.
2. Fold each circle into quarters.
3. Unfold the circles and cut along one fold line to the center of each circle. Place one circle on top of the other, with the cut edges aligned.
4. Lift up one of the top quarters and tape the one above it to the bottom, as shown.
5. Fold the top quarter on top of the section beside it. Keep folding the quarters counterclockwise until the book is pie shaped.
6. Trim the rounded edges so that they are even. Counting the cover, the book will have eight "pages."
7. Write the title on the cover of the book.
